drop of noisy traffic is replaced by the sounds of a warm tropical breeze rustling the leaves of palm trees. My home in Palm Beach is the one place in the world where I can truly get away from it all.

The house is called Concha Marina, which means seashell in Spanish. It was built in the 1920s by the famous architect Addison Mizner, and this is where he actually lived. Mizner built about 30 homes and his buildings are now historic landmarks, including this one. For that reason, if I move a chair from left to right, I'm dead.

Well, it's not quite that bad, but I did have trouble with the pool because I wanted to tile the edge with blue Spanish-style tiles and the town's powers-that-be said "no way." However, when I pointed out to them that with no obvious edge to the pool, people at my parties would be falling in and breaking bones (not to mention my favorite wine glasses), they soon let me have my way.

The shape of the pool is my own design, inspired by a gorgeous pool that I saw in Hawaii. The whole area used to be a lawn with a sad little fountain in the middle, but I really wanted somewhere to take a dip. However, I couldn't

really envision anyone (especially myself) doing 100
Olympic-style laps – I wanted more of a calming oasis, which is why I painted it green rather than the more obvious turquoise. Part of its charm is that at any moment it can be turned into a magnificent fountain – there are water jets at each corner. The pool is partly shaded by a huge seagrape tree with low-hanging

branches. Soon after I moved in, I had to hang a painted wooden parrot from the tree because so many people were banging their heads on the branches and slipping into the pool. Now they see the parrot first, and I'm no longer running out for Band-Aids every five minutes.

I do have permission to build a saltwater pool at the front of the house, but





as it's so close to the ocean and quite exposed, it does get a little windy out there. If I'm looking for seawater, I prefer to cross the lawn and go through the hidden tunnel that brings me right out at the most beautiful private beach.

Concha Marina has a very Mediterranean feel, as do most of Addison Mizner's buildings. The wooden ceilings are handpainted with lovely pastel designs, lending a light, airy feeling to the house.

I developed the Mediterranean theme by shipping incredible ceramics from Italy and Spanish-style tiles from Mexico. A couple of the
